However, if you're feeling emboldened, you can also contact the senators listed below. Some are moderates known for their independent streaks. Some face uphill reelection campaigns and may want to avoid making a decision that would cause them to lose their seat. Some have explicitly stated that they would not ram through a nomination in this exact situation. We hope all will take a stand and put country before party.

Here are some tips:

- **If you call a senator's office**, you usually have the option to just leave a message, but if you're willing to wait on hold, you might be able to talk to a staffer. They'll definitely be keeping track of how many people are making these calls, and politicians can occasionally be swayed by significant call volume.
- **If you email a senator**, you'll probably get a fairly stock response and get put on their mailing list, so be sure to unsubscribe or you'll be on the receiving end of a daily barrage of partisan nonsense.
- **Senators tend to be most responsive to their own constituents**, so your best chance of success is to contact your state's senator(s). You're welcome to try contacting senators from other states, but be aware that you might get a response along the lines of, "Sorry, you don't live in my state and I prioritize the needs of my constituents."

Here's a sample script you can use when calling a senator's office:

"My name is _____. (If you're calling YOUR senator, mention that you're a resident of {your city/town, your county}.) I'm calling regarding the death of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg and the process of filling her vacancy on the Supreme Court. As Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell stated upon

the death of Justice Antonin Scalia in 2016, ‘The American people should have a voice in the selection of their next Supreme Court justice. Therefore, this vacancy should not be filled until we have a new president.’ As such, I trust that Leader McConnell and his colleagues in the Senate will follow this precedent and delay any confirmation hearings until after the November election. The will of the people must prevail. Thank you.”
